- **What’s New?**

We will be **allowing team members to bird separately this year!** If you do chose to bird together, please wear face masks and practice social distancing.

- **Where & When?**

Fall Flight 2020 will take place over the entire 24 hours of Saturday September 19th, that is, from midnight to midnight. You may bird anywhere in the counties of Jefferson, Lewis, Onondaga, Oswego, Madison, Oneida, Herkimer, and Cayuga to the north of Route 31. If you’re not sure whether a place you want to bird is within the boundary, please call or e-mail us. Team members have to bird together — no splitting up.

- **Register.**

Please get in touch with us prior to the event to let us know that you will be participating. We will need your team name, member names, address, a telephone number and an E-mail address to which we can send the computerized reporting form. Timed to take place at the peak of fall migration, this is the perfect opportunity to go out and find some great birds. Through your participation, you can help document the occurrence of birds throughout Onondaga Audubon's service area and provide financial support for the important work of Onondaga Audubon, all while enjoying a day of birding. So, mark your calendar, contact your bird-watching teammates, and start making plans for Birdathon!

How Birdathon Works

Date and Time: Go afield on Saturday, September 19th for as many (or as few) hours as desired between midnight and midnight. — no rain date!

Boundaries: Anywhere you like within Jefferson, Lewis, Onondaga, Oswego, Madison, Oneida and Herkimer Counties, plus Cayuga County north of Route 31.

Teams: Join another, form you own, or go solo. No assigned territories. Splitting up is allowed this year – please wear face masks when around others and maintain social distancing!

Count: Carefully identify species by sight and/or ear — the honor system please!

Fund-raising: Lining up sponsors (flat donations or so much per species) is optional, but definitely encouraged! We hope you will make a goal of ~\$100 per team member.

Bird List Deadline: Submit your results by 4 pm Sunday.

Final Bird Results: Birding and fundraising results will appear in *The Kestrel* newsletter and on the OAS web site.

Dollars Deadline: Turn in to Birdathon Coordinator by November 15.
